

# Constitution

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### NAME

- 1.1 The name of the organisation shall be Yachting New Zealand Incorporated ("(YNZ").).
- 1.2 The registered office of YNZ shallwill be as determined by the Board and advised to the Registrar of Incorporated Societies from time to time.

# 2. **DEFINITIONS**

2.1 In this Constitution unless the context otherwise requires:

Act means the Incorporated Societies Act 2022 and any regulations made under that Act.

AGM means the Annual General Meetingannual general meeting of YNZ.

**Appointed Board Member** means a <u>director board member</u> appointed under <u>Rule 15.3 clause</u> 14.6.

**Board** means the **Board** of directors of YNZ.

**Board Member** means a member of the Board including Elected Board Members and Appointed Board Members.

**Chair** means the Board Member elected as Chair of YNZ under this Constitution.

Chief Executive means the Chief Executive appointed by the Board.

**Class Association** means an association representing a class of yacht or boat which complies with the requirements of membership and which has been approved by the Board.

### Committee is defined in Rule 15.4

Commercial Maritime Member means an entity whose purposes are consistent with those of YNZ, which complies with the requirements of membership and which has been approved by the Board.

**Code of Conduct** means the Code of Conduct that may be adopted by the Board and-relating to the minimum required standards of behaviour and ethical dealings that shall be required of all athletes, coaches, officials, Member Clubs and other Members.

Constitution means this Constitution which records.

Contact Details means: (a) a physical or electronic address; and (b) a telephone number.

<u>Contact Person</u> means a person holding the <u>Rulesposition</u> of <u>contact person for YNZ being</u> the person whom the Registrar of Incorporated Societies can contact when needed.

**Delegate** means a proxy appointed to represent a Member Club at a General Meeting of YNZ-pursuant to Rule 14.14 under clause 13.18.

**Elected Board Member** means a director board member elected under Rule 15.3 clause 14.3.

**General Meeting** means any Annual or Special General Meeting of YNZ HPSNZ means High-Performance Sport New Zealand AGM or SGM. Governance and Remuneration Committee means the committee established by the Board under clause 14.7.

**Individual Club Member** is a natural person who is <u>deemed</u>, <u>and has consented</u> to be, a member of a Member Club in accordance with its <u>Constitution</u>constitution.

Maritime Individual Member means an entity whose objects are consistent individual who complies with those the requirements of membership and who has been approved by the Board.

#### Matters means:

(a) YNZ's performance of its activities or exercise of its powers; or

(a)(b) an arrangement, an agreement or a contract made or entered, or proposed to be made or entered, into by YNZ.

Maritime Members means Commercial Maritime Members and Non-Commercial Maritime Members.

**Member Club** means a club which complies with the requirements of membership and which has been approved by the Board.

**Member** means a <u>Member Club,an</u> entity or individual <u>which has been admitted within the rules of this Constitution and which has who has fulfilled the conditions of membership set out in this Constitution.</u>

Non-Commercial Maritime Member means an entity whose purposes are consistent with those of YNZ which complies with the requirements of membership and which has been approved by the Board.

**Notice** means notice given personally, by mail, or email or facsimile to the Member's last known address.

PNZ means Paralympics New Zealand

President means the person elected as President in accordance with Rule 15.3

Officers has the meaning set out in the Act.

**Ordinary Resolution** means a resolution passed by a majority of the votes cast.

**Regional Association** means those associations specified in Rule 8.0. clause 7.

**Regulations** means any regulations, by-laws, directives, codes, policies or procedures adopted by YNZ either in General Meeting or by the Board pursuant to these Rules under this Constitution.

Rules means this Constitution and Rule shall have a corresponding meaning.

**SGM** means a Special General Meetingspecial general meeting of YNZ.

Special Resolution means a resolution passed by two thirds of the votes cast.

**SNZ** means Sport New Zealand, the Crown agency established under the Sport and Recreation Act 2002.

Sports Anti-Doping Rules means the rules made under the Sports Anti-Doping Act 2006.

**SDT** means the Sports Disputes Tribunal of New Zealand, established by Sport New Zealand and continued under the Sports Anti-Doping Act 2006.

Voting Member means a Member Club that is entitled to vote at a General Meeting.

World Sailing means sailing's international governing body.

YNZ means Yachting New Zealand.

# 2.0 Interpretation.

- 2.2 In this Constitution unless the context otherwise requires:
  - a) Expressions defined in Rule 2 shall have the defined meaning in the whole of this Constitution;
  - (a) Clause headings and other headings are for ease of reference only and will not affect the interpretation of this Constitution;
  - (b) Any obligation not to do anything will include an obligation not to suffer, permit or cause that thing to be done;
  - (c) Words importing the singular number will include the plural and vice versa;
  - (d) References to persons will include references to individuals, companies, corporations, partnerships, firms, joint ventures, associations, trusts, organisations, governmental or other regulatory bodies or authorities or other entities in each case whether or not having <u>a</u> separate legal personality;
  - (e) References to any gender include all genders-:

#### 3.0 OBJECTS

(f) References to statutory provisions are references to those provisions as amended or reenacted.

## 3. **PURPOSES**

The objectspurposes of Yachting New Zealand are:

- 2.33.1 To deliver high-quality experiences and opportunities for participants of all levels and backgrounds that fosters a lifelong passion for sailing, boating and the environment; including:
  - (a) Competitive yachting and recreational yachting and boating;
  - (b) International and national competition and the participation by New Zealand sailors;
  - (c) High performance programmes for sailors who aspire to participate in international competition;
  - (d) Development programmes promoted by YNZ and its Member Clubs;
  - (e) Recruitment, training, qualification and registration of race officials to the standards required for the implementation of both YNZ's and World Sailing's Racing Rules of Sailing;
  - (f) Recruitment, training, qualification and registration of coaches to serve at school, club and national levels of the sport-;

- 2.43.2 To ensure the sport of yachting is conducted in an environment free from the use of any performance enhancing substances or methods which are prohibited by the International Olympic Committee, the Drug Free Sport New Zealand Sports Drug Agency, (or its successor), YNZ or World Sailing:
- 2.53.3 To represent and promote the interests of its Members;
- 2.63.4 To advocate for free access to coastal and inland waters for yachting and boating;
- 2.73.5 To maintain membership of World Sailing;
- 2.83.6 To maintain membership of the New Zealand Olympic Committee;
- Zealand, High Performance Sport New Zealand, Paralympics New Zealand and the New Zealand Olympic Committee;
- 2.103.8 To establish Codes of Conduct applicable to Members:
- 2.113.9 To formulate, adopt and implement such Rules and Regulations as may be deemed appropriate for the governance, management and operation of yachting and boating in New Zealand including but not limited to:
  - (a) Racing Rules of Sailing;
  - (b) Regulations for regattas;
  - (c) Directives for race officials and coaches;
  - (d) Anti-doping Doping;
  - (e) Safety and Health;
  - (f) National selection;
  - (g) Anti-Match Fixing and Sports Betting;
  - (h) Integrity.

## 4.0 POWERS

- 4.1 YNZ has the power to:
  - a) Make, alter, rescind and enforce the Constitution, regulations, policies and procedures for the governance, management and operation of YNZ;
  - b) Determine who are its Members including admitting, suspending and terminating Members;
  - c) Determine, implement and enforce disciplinary, dispute and appeal rules, policies and procedures including sanctions and penalties and other rules, policies and procedures applicable to its members.
  - d) Promote and manage compliance with the Sports Anti-Doping Rules made by Drug Free Sport New Zealand, and any amendments to or replacements of those Rules.
  - e) Use such of its funds to pay the costs and expenses of furthering or carrying out its objects, and for that purpose employ such people as may be appropriate;
  - f) Purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire, exchange, sell, lease or otherwise dispose of property, rights or privileges to further carry out its objects as may be appropriate;
  - g) Enter into contractual relationships with sailors, representative team members, employees, contractors, sponsors or any other such persons or bodies as may be appropriate;

- h) Refer appropriate matters to the SDT for determination;
- i) Carry on any other business in connection with the promotion and fostering of vachting and boating in New Zealand;
- Control and raise money including borrowing or raising money by debenture, bonds, mortgage or other means, with or without security;
- k) Apply for, purchase, or otherwise acquire any intellectual property rights for any of the purposes of YNZ, and use, exercise, develop, or grant licenses in respect thereof:
- Invest funds in bonds, debentures or other securities in any company or other entity and to sell or dispose of such interests;
- m) Lend and advance money or give credit to any person and to give guarantees and/or indemnities for the payment in money or the performance of contracts or obligations by any person;
- n) Delegate to any person, Board, committee or sub-committee the powers of YNZ;
- **e)** Determine disputes and appeals on matters relating to YNZ and yachting and boating;
- p) Indemnify its directors, and employees against any liability incurred in carrying out the objectives of YNZ specified in the Constitution except where such liabilities have been incurred as a consequence of the wilful breach of these Rules or other wilful neglect by the person concerned;
- q) Do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of its objects;

## 3.4. ANTI-DOPING

- 3.14.1 YNZ adopts the Sports Anti-Doping Rules ("(SADR")) made by Drug Free Sport New Zealand-pursuant to the Sports Anti-Doping Act 2006, and any amendments to or replacements of those RulesSADR, as its Anti-Doping Policy.
- 3.24.2 YNZ agrees to be bound by the SADR and any amendments to or replacements of the SADR.

  All Members agree to be bound by the SADR and all Member must include in their constitution a requirement that their members agree to be bound by the SADR.

those Rules. All members of affiliated Clubs of YNZ agree to be bound to the SADR through their club's membership of YNZ.

### 4.5. MEMBERSHIP

- 4.45.1 The membership of YNZ shallwill consist of:
  - (a) Member Clubs;
  - (b) Regional Associations-;
  - (c) Individual Members-:
  - (d) Commercial and Maritime Members;
  - (d)(e) Non-Commercial Maritime Members-;
  - (e)(f) Class Associations-:
  - (f)(g) Life Members.

# 5.6. MEMBER CLUBS

- 5.16.1 A club wishing to be a Member Club shallmay apply to the Board for membership. Such application shallwill be determined by the Board in accordance with the Regulations.
- 6.2 A club consents to becoming a Member Club by paying the membership fee.
- 5.26.3 Each Member Club shallwill, on request, provide to YNZ a copy of its Constitution constitution and any proposed amendments to it. The Board may require a Member Club to amend its Constitution if it, or any proposed rule within it, is inconsistent or in conflict with thethis Constitution or regulations, by-laws or policies of YNZthe Regulations.
- 5.36.4 Each Member Club shallmust be a member of a Regional Association if a Regional Association exists in the Member Club's principal location.
- 5.46.5 Each Member Club shallmust maintain a register of its members. Each Member Club shallwill provide its register of members and all details contained within it, to YNZ as requested from time to timeon request.
- 5.56.6 In addition to the obligations as a Member, each Member Club must:
  - (a) Administer, promote and develop yachting and boating in the <u>Member Club in</u> accordance with the <u>objectspurposes</u> of YNZ;
  - (b) Be an incorporated society under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908 or the Act;
  - (c) Appoint a Delegate to represent the Member Club at Regional Association meetings;
  - (d) Have rulesa constitution which are consistent with these Rules this Constitution;
  - (e) Act in good faith and loyally with YNZ, its Regional Association and its <u>membersother</u> <u>Members</u> to ensure the maintenance and enhancement of yachting and boating for the collective and mutual benefit of YNZ, its Regional Association, the Member Club and their respective members;
  - (f) Promote mutual trust and confidence between YNZ, the Regional Association and the Member Club and their respective <a href="Members\_members">Members\_members</a> and at all times act on behalf of, and in the interests of, <a href="itstheir">itstheir</a> members.

# 6.7. 8.0—REGIONAL ASSOCIATIONS

- 6.17.1 The Regional Associations as at the date this Constitution comes into force are:
  - (a) Northland Yachting Association;
  - (b) Auckland Yachting and Boating Association;
  - (c) Waikato/Thames Yachting Association;
  - (d) West Coast North Island Yachting Association;
  - (e) Wellington Yachting Association;
  - (f) Canterbury Yachting Association;
  - (g) Otago Yachting Association;

- (h) Southland Yachting Association.
- 6.27.2 Boundaries for the Regional Associations will be delineated on an appropriately detailed map of New Zealand held by the Chief Executive and available for inspection upon reasonable request.
- 7.3 An entity becomes, and consents to becoming, a Regional Association by accepting an invitation from the Board to become one.
- 6.37.4 Each Regional Association must:
  - (a) At all times act for and on behalf of the interests of YNZ, the Member Clubs and yachting and boating;
  - (b) Comply with all reasonable directions of the Board;
  - (c) On request, provide to YNZ a copy of its constitution and any proposed amendments to

    it. The Board may require a Regional Association to amend its constitution if it, or any
    proposed amendment to it, is inconsistent or in conflict with this Constitution or the
    Regulations;
  - (c)(d) Do all that is reasonably necessary to enable the Purposesobjects to be achieved;
  - (d)(e) Act in good faith and loyally to ensure the maintenance and enhancement of YNZ and yachting and boating, its standards, quality and reputation for the collective and mutual benefit of the Member Clubs and yachting and boating;
  - (e)(f) Make full and proper disclosure to the Board of all matters of importance to the Regional Association, YNZ and yachting and boating;
  - (f)(g) Not acquire a private advantage at the expense of any of YNZ or other Regional Association or yachting and boating;
  - (g)(h) Operate with mutual trust and confidence in pursuit of the Purposesobjects;
  - (h)(i) Act as a channel for communications between Members Clubs or Individual Club Members of Member Clubs within its region and YNZ;
  - (i)(j) Ensure that any rules it may make in governing local affairs do not conflict with this Constitutione Rules and the Regulations of Yachting New Zealand.

## 7-8. INDIVIDUAL, CLASS ASSOCIATIONS AND MARITIME MEMBER

- 7.18.1 An individual or entity wishing to be an Individual Member, Class Association or Maritime Member wishing to be a Member shall may apply to the Board for membership. Such application shallwill be determined by the Board in accordance with the Regulations.
- 8.2 Except in the case set out in clause 8.3, an individual or entity specified in clause 8.1 consents to becoming a Member by signing the applicable application form.
- 8.3 As a condition of an individual's appointment or election as a Board Member, an individual consents to becoming an Individual Member as part of the nomination for election or their application for appointment as a Board Member.
- 7.28.4 Each Class Association or Maritime Member shallmust, on request, provide to YNZ a copy of its Constitution constitution and any proposed amendments to it. The Board may require a

Class Association or <u>a Maritime Member to amend its constitution if it, or any proposed clause within it, is inconsistent or in conflict with this Constitution if it, or any proposed rule within it, is inconsistent or in conflict with the Constitution or or the Regulations, by-laws or policies of YNZ.</u>

## 8.9. LIFE MEMBER

- 8.19.1 Life membership may be granted in recognition and appreciation of outstanding service by a person for the benefit of YNZ. Any person may be nominated for life membership of YNZ. Such nomination must be made to the Board in writing setting out the grounds for the nomination. The Board must then determine in its discretion as to whether the nomination should be forwarded to a General Meeting for determination by the Members. Life membership of such nominee is only obtained by Special Resolution passed at thea General Meeting.
- 9.2 A nominee consents to becoming a Life Member upon acceptance of their life membership.

# 9.10. MEMBER APPLICATIONS, ENTITLEMENTS AND REQUIREMENTS

- 9.110.1 All Members are bound by these Rules, this Constitution and the Regulations, by-laws, policies and procedures of YNZ.
- 9.210.2 In order to receive or continue to receive membership entitlements, Members must meet all requirements of membership set out in these Rulesthis Constitution or as otherwise set by the Board including payment of any membership or other fees within a required time period.
- 9.310.3 The failure by a Member to comply with Rule 11.2 clause 10.2 may result in withdrawal of membership entitlements as determined by the Board, but shalldoes not excuse such Member from being bound by these Rulesthis Constitution.
- 9.410.4 Member Clubs are entitled to:
  - (a) Participate in YNZ's and their Regional Association's activities subject at all times to being eligible for, and complying with, the terms and conditions of, such activities;
  - (b) Receive notices and papers and be able to attend (at their cost), speak and vote at General Meetings via a Delegate and in accordance with the Regulations.
- 9.510.5 Individual Members, Class Associations and Maritime Members are entitled to receive notices and papers and authorised representatives are able tomay attend (at their cost) and speak at General Meetings, but are not entitled to vote.
- 9.610.6 Life Members are not required to pay any membership fee and they are also entitled to such other benefits (if any) as determined by the Board. Life Members may attend and speak at General Meetings but are not entitled to vote.

## 40.11. DURATION OF MEMBERSHIP

40.111.1 A Member may resign by written notice to YNZ. The resignation shall taketakes effect from the end of the current financial year of YNZ, and the Member shall remainremains liable to pay all subscriptions, levies and any other applicable fees for the current financial year.

- 42.0 Membership may also be withdrawn, suspended or terminated by the Board if a Member fails to comply with these Rules including this Constitution or any Codes of Conduct or
- 10.211.2 requirements set out in Regulations, by-laws, policies or procedures of YNZ or if a Member acts in a manner which is considered by the Board to be harmful to YNZ or inconsistent with the standards of behaviour expected of a Member, provided that:
  - (a) if the matter that the withdrawal, suspension or termination is about has not been the subject of a process either under clause 20 or under another process allowed by clause 20, then the matter must be dealt with in accordance with the dispute resolution process under clause 20; and
  - (b) paragraph (a) does not limit the Board from imposing an interim suspension and taking any other action pending the outcome of a dispute resolution process.
- 40.311.3 A Member whose membership is withdrawn, suspended or terminated by the Board shallis not be entitled to any right or privilege of a Member, but this shalldoes not excuse the Member from being bound by these Rules. Any such Member may apply for the matter to be reviewed by such process as may be specified in any Regulations, by-laws, policies or procedures of YNZthis Constitution.
  - 12.1 Any former Member may apply for re-admission in the manner prescribed for admissions, and may be re-admitted by decision of the Board.
- The Board shallmust keep and maintain a register of its Members in accordance with the Act and the Regulations.

## 44.12. MEMBERSHIP FEES

- 11.112.1 The membership and other fees payable by Members shallwill be determined at the AGM. The membership fees shallwill be effective for the year commencing 1\_July 1\_following the AGM in any year.
- The levy for each Member Club shallwill be calculated on an amount payable for each Individual Club Member of the Member Club.
- 41.312.3 Any Member which has not paid its subscriptions or levy due to YNZ in full by 30 September shall be seemed to be suspended until the subscription or levy has been paid in full.
- 41.412.4 A Member Club under such suspension shallis not be entitled to be represented or vote at any General Meeting until the suspension has ended.

# 42.13. GENERAL MEETINGS

- 42.113.1 YNZ must hold an AGM once every year at such place, time and date as the Board determines, but not more than 6 months after the end of the financial year and not more than 15 months after the lastprevious AGM.
- 42.213.2 Members must be given at least 3060 days' written notice of General Meetings.the date of the AGM. The notice can be given by such methods as the Board may determine including by email, facsimile, post or other written communication.

- 13.3 Except where this Constitution provides otherwise, no business will be considered at a

  General Meeting unless written notice from a Member has been sent to the Board at least 40

  days before the date of the General Meeting. The Board may consider and provide
  recommendations on all such notices.
- An agenda containing the business to be discussed at the AGM will be sent by the Board to the Members at least 30 days before the date of the AGM. No additional items of business can be voted on other than those set out in the agenda, but the Members present may agree by Special Resolution to discuss any other items.
- 42.313.5 All Members shall beare entitled to attend a General Meeting but only Member Clubs, through their Delegate may vote.
- 12.413.6 Full minutes shallmust be kept of all General Meetings and made available uponon request by Members.
- An accidental omission to give notice of a General Meeting to, or a failure to receive notice of a General Meeting by, a Member does not invalidate the proceedings at that General Meeting.
- 42.513.8 Any irregularity, error or omission in notices, agendas and relevant papers of General Meetings or the omission to give notice within the required time frame or the omission to give notice as specified in <a href="Rule-14.2clause-13.2">Rule-14.2clause-13.2</a> and any other error in the organisation of the <a href="meeting-shall-General Meeting-will">meeting-shall-General Meeting-will</a> not invalidate the meeting nor prevent the <a href="meeting-General Meeting-general Meeting-g
  - (a) The <u>chairChair</u> in <u>his or hertheir</u> discretion determines that it is still appropriate for the meeting to proceed despite the irregularity, error or omission; or
  - (b) A motion to proceed is put to the <u>meetingGeneral Meeting</u> and a majority of two-thirds of votes cast is obtained in favour of the motion.

# **Purpose of AGM**

- 12.613.9 The AGM shallwill be called for the following purposes:
  - (a) To receive from the Board a report and audited statement of financial position and statement of financial performance statements for the preceding year;
  - (b) To receive from the Board an annual report on the operations and affairs of YNZ for the preceding year;
  - (c) To receive from the Board notice of any disclosures of conflicts of interest made by

    Board Members during the preceding year, including a brief summary of the Matters, or

    types of Matters, to which those disclosures all relate;
  - (b)(d) To elect the Elected Board Members of YNZ;
  - (c)(e) To elect an auditor;
  - (d)(f) To determine the membership and other fees;
  - (e)(g) To elect Life Members;
  - (f)(h) To decide on any motion which has been properly submitted to the Board for consideration at the AGM.

42.71.1 Except where these Rules otherwise provide no business shall be considered at a General Meeting unless notice in writing has been sent to the Board not less than 40 days before the date of the General Meeting. The Board may consider and provide recommendations on all such notices.

# **Special General Meetings**

- 12.813.10 The Board must call a Special General Meeting (SGM) upon a written request from:
  - (a) The Board itself; or
  - (b) 10 or more Member Clubs.
- 12.913.11 The written request for an SGM must state the purpose for which the SGM is requested.
- 12.1013.12 The SGM must only deal with the business for which the SGM is requested.
- <u>12.1113.13</u> The notice requirements for Board must give Members at least 20 days of the SGM-are the same as for General Meetings, unless the Board in its discretion determines that the nature of the SGM business is of such urgency that a shorter period of notice may be given.

#### Quorum

- 13.14 A General Meeting must be held by a quorum of persons:
  - (a) being assembled together at the time and place appointed for the meeting; or
  - (b) participating in the meeting by means of audio link, audiovisual link, or other electronic communication; or
  - (c) by a combination of both of the methods described in paragraphs (a) and (b).
- <u>12.1213.15</u> Delegates representing not less than ten Member Clubs, present <u>personallyin person or through audio, audio visual link or other electronic communication</u> or by proxy, <u>shallwill</u> constitute a quorum at a General Meeting. <u>The quorum must be present at all times during the meeting.</u>
- 13.16 If a quorum is not reached within 30 minutes of the scheduled start time of an AGM, the AGM will be adjourned to a day, time and place determined by the Chair. If no quorum is achieved at the further AGM, the Delegates present in person or through audio, audio visual link or other electronic communication or by proxy, 15 minutes after the scheduled start time of that further AGM are deemed to constitute a valid quorum.
- 13.17 If a quorum is not reached within 30 minutes of the scheduled start time of an SGM, the SGM is cancelled.

## Control of meetings and voting

- 14.0 The President shall be the chair at a General Meeting. In the absence of the President, a member of the Board shall be chair.
- 13.18 The Chair will be the chair at a General Meeting. In the absence of the Chair, the Board will appoint a Board Member to be the chair.
- 42.1313.19 Each Member Club shallwill be entitled to appoint a Delegate to a General Meeting.
- 42.1413.20 A Delegate shallwill be deemed to have been duly appointed when written notice, in the form prescribed approved by the Board, has been received by the Chief Executive, 48 hours prior to the commencement of the meeting General Meeting.

- <u>12.1513.21</u> Delegate appointments will be required for each General Meeting, and the appointment will be effective for that meeting and any adjournment or continuation of that meeting.
- 42.1613.22 Unless otherwise required by this Constitution:
  - (a) An Ordinary Resolution shall beis sufficient to pass a resolution;
  - (b) Voting may be conducted on the voices, by show of hands, or by poll at the request of the chairChair or any Delegate.
- <u>12.1713.23</u> Each Member Club <u>shall havehas</u> the number of votes calculated by reference to the number of Individual Club Members <u>in their Member Club</u> in the year prior to the General Meeting. The number of votes allocated to each Member Club is determined on the following scale of Individual Club Members in that Member Club:

### 14. BOARD

### Role of the Board

12.1914.1 The governance Subject to the Act and management of YNZ shall be vested in this Constitution, the Board which may exercise has all the powers of YNZ necessary for governing, managing, and do all things which are not expressly required to be undertaken by YNZ at a General Meetingfor directing and supervising the management of, the operations and affairs of YNZ.

# Membership of the Board

- 12.2014.2 Members of the The Board shall be will comprise of:
  - (a) Up to five persons, including the President, elected by the AGM under Rule 15.3 a (Five Elected Board Members);
  - (b) Up to four persons appointed under Rule 15.3 d (Appointed Board Members)..

# **Election/Appointment of the Board**

Board Members of the Board shallwill be elected or appointed as follows:

12.2114.3 The Elected Board Members, including the President shall will be elected by a majority of persons entitled to voteOrdinary Resolution at an AGM. Where there are more candidates

- than positions for Elected Board Members, the election shallwill be determined by the order in which candidates receive the largest number of votes from the Member Clubs entitled to vote. Those candidates with the least number of votes in relation to the number of positions for Elected Board Members shallwill fail to be elected.
- 42.2214.4 Elected Board Members including the President shallmust be nominated by at least two Member Clubs in the form approved by the Board and shall be received at the registered office of YNZ not less than at least 40 days before the date set for the AGM.
- 12.2314.5 Two Board Members shallmust have their primary place of residence outside the Auckland Council region. In the event of any doubt, the primary place of residence will be determined by the Board.
- 12.2414.6 The Appointed Board Members shallwill be appointed by the Board on the recommendation of the Governance and RemunerationBoard Appointments Committee.
- 12.2514.7 The Board shallwill establish an independenta Governance and Remuneration Board Appointments Committee, which will have as one of its for the purposes of assessing potential candidates for the position of appointed Board Member and for making appropriate recommendations to the Board for all such appointments.

### **Term of Office of Board Members**

- The term of office for all Board Members shallwill be three years, expiring on the anniversary of their appointment. A Board Member may be re-elected or reappointed to the Board for a maximum of two subsequent and consecutive terms of office (being a total of nine years).
- 42.2714.9 A Board Member who has served the maximum number of terms or years may be eligible for election or appointment after a minimum stand down period of twelve months.

#### Vacancies on the Board

- 42.2814.10 In the event that If there is a vacancy in the Elected Board Members, the remaining Board Members may appoint a person of their choice to fill the vacancy or the Board may leave the vacancy unfilled until the next AGM.
- <u>12.2914.11</u> The term of office for a person appointed as an Elected Board Member to fill a vacancy under Rule <u>15.7 shallclause 14.10 will</u> expire at the AGM following their appointment.

  Thereafter the vacancy shall be determined in accordance with these Rules.
- 14.12 If there is a vacancy in the Appointed Board Members, the remaining Board Members may at any time fill the vacancy under clause 14.6.

## **Removal of Board Member**

- <u>12.3014.13</u> The Members in an <u>SGM called for this purpose</u> may, <u>by Special Resolution</u>, remove any Board Member before the expiration of their term <u>ef office by Special Resolution in an SGM called for this purpose</u>.
  - 15.0 Where that removed Board Member was an Elected Board Member the vacancy shall be filled in accordance with Rule 15.7. Where that removed Board Memberwas an Appointed Board member the vacancy shall be filled in accordance with Rule 15.3.

- <u>12.3114.14</u> Upon the Chief Executive receiving a request for <u>ana</u> SGM for the purpose of removing a Board Member, the Chief Executive <u>shallwill</u> send the notice to the Board Member concerned and the Members.
- 42.3214.15 Following notice and before voting on the resolution to remove a Board Member, the Board Member affected by the proposed resolution shallmust be given the opportunity prior to and at the SGM to make submissions in writing and/or verbally to the Board and the persons entitled to be present at the General Meeting about the proposed resolution.
- 14.16 The Board may, by Special Resolution, remove any Board Member from the Board before the

  expiry of their term of office if the Board considers the Board Member concerned has

  seriously breached duties under this Constitution or the Act or is no longer suitable to be a

  Board Member. The Board Member who is the subject of the motion will be counted for the
  purpose of reaching a quorum, but will not participate in the vote on the motion.
- 14.17 Before considering a motion for removal, the Board Member affected by the motion must be given:
  - (a) notice that a Board Meeting is to be held to discuss the motion to remove the Board Member; and
  - (b) adequate time to prepare a response; and
  - (c) the opportunity prior to the Board Meeting to make written submissions; and
  - (d) the opportunity to be heard at the Board Meeting.
- 14.18 A person ceases to be a Board Member if the person:
  - (a) resigns by delivering a signed notice of resignation to the Board;
  - (b) is removed from office under this Constitution;
  - (c) becomes disqualified from being an officer under section 47(3) of the Act; or
  - (d) dies.

## **Board Meetings and Duties of the Board**

- 42.3314.19 At its first meeting following the AGM, the Board must elect a chair Chair and deputy chair from among the Board Members.
- The role of a chairthe Chair is to chair Board meetings of the Board and General Meetings of Members and to represent the Board. In the event of the unavailability of a chairthe Chair for any reason, then the deputy chair shallwill undertake the chair's Chair's role during the period of unavailability.
  - 15.1 The duty of each Board Member is to pursue the objects of YNZ and to exercise the powers of YNZ for fulfilment of the objects and in so doing a Board Member must:
    - Regularly attend Board meetings and General Meetings of YNZ;
    - b) Provide good governance for YNZ;
    - c) Regularly monitor and review the performance of YNZ;
    - d) Act in the best interests of YNZ at all times:
    - e) Formulate such by-laws, Regulations, policies and procedures as are appropriate

- for YNZ;
- f) Where appropriate, engage in activities to promote, market, represent and fundraise for YNZ;
- g) Do such other things within these Rules as the Board agrees to promote the objects of YNZ.
- 42.3514.21 Board meetings may be called at any time by the <a href="ehairChair">ehairChair</a> but generally the Board shallwill meet at regular intervals agreed by the Board.
- <u>12.3614.22</u> Except to the extent specified in <u>these Rulesthis Constitution</u>, the Board <u>shallmay</u> regulate its own procedure.
- 12.3714.23 The quorum for a Board meeting shallwill be two-thirds of the Board Members of the Board.
- 42.3814.24 Each Board Member shall have has one vote at Board meetings. In the event of a deadlock, the chair shall have Chair has an additional casting vote. Voting shall be by voices or upon request of any Board Member, by a show of hands or by a ballot.
- 42.3914.25 A resolution in writing signed or consented to by email, facsimile or other forms of visible or other electronic communication by a majority of the Board shallwill be valid as if it had been passed at a Board meeting of the Board. Any such resolution may consist of several documents in the same form each signed by one or more of the Board Members.
- 42.4014.26 Any Board Member may participate in any Board meeting of the Board and vote on any proposed resolution at a Board meeting of the Board without being physically present. This may only occur at meetings by telephone, through video conferencing facilities or by other means of electronic communication provided that prior notice of the meeting is given to all Board Members and all persons participating in the meeting are able to hear each other effectively and simultaneously. Participation by a Board Member in this manner at a meeting shallwill constitute the presence of that Board Member at that meeting.
- <u>42.4114.27</u> The Board may, by majority vote, reimburse its Board Members for their actual and reasonable expenses incurred in the conduct of YNZ's business in accordance with the Board policy for reimbursement.

# If any situation arises which, Officers' Duties

# 14.28 An Officer:

- (a) when exercising powers or performing duties as an Officer, must act in good faith and in what the opinion of Officer believes to be the Board, is not provided best interests of YNZ;
- (b) must exercise a power as an Officer for in-a proper purpose;
- (c) must not act, or agree to YNZ acting, in a manner that contravenes the Rules, Regulations, by-laws or policies Act or this Constitution;
- (d) when exercising powers or performing duties as an Officer, must exercise the care and diligence that a reasonable person with the same responsibilities would exercise in the same circumstances, taking into account, but without limitation the nature of YNZ, the matternature of the decision, the position of the Officer and the nature of the responsibilities undertaken by them;

- (e) must not agree to the activities of YNZ being carried on in a manner likely to create a substantial risk of serious loss to YNZ's creditors or cause or allow the activities of YNZ to be carried on in a manner likely to create a substantial risk of serious loss to YNZ's creditors;
- (f) must not agree to YNZ incurring an obligation unless the Officer believes at that time on reasonable grounds that YNZ will be determinedable to perform the obligation when it is required to do so; and
- (a)(g) when exercising powers or performing duties as an Officer, may rely on reports, statements, and financial data and other information prepared or supplied, and on professional or expert advice given, by the Board.:
  - (i) an employee of YNZ whom the Officer believes on reasonable grounds to be reliable and competent in relation to the matters concerned;
  - (ii) a professional adviser or expert in relation to matters that the Officer believes on reasonable grounds to be within the person's professional or expert competence; or
  - (iii) any other Officer or subcommittee of Officers on which the Officer did not serve in relation to matters within the Officer's or subcommittee's designated authority,

if the Officer acts in good faith and makes proper inquiry where the need for inquiry is indicated by the circumstances, and the Officer has no knowledge that the reliance is unwarranted.

## **Board Committees**

- 42.4214.29 The Board may be supported by Sub-Committees to assist in carrying out its functions.
- 42.4314.30 The Board may appoint a Board Member as liaison for each Sub-Committee.
- <u>12.4414.31</u> Members of each <u>Sub-</u>Committee <u>shallwill</u> be appointed on an annual basis by the Board in consultation with the respective chair of each <u>Sub-</u>Committee.
- <u>12.4514.32</u> The <u>PresidentChair</u>, Chief Executive and/or a member of the <u>YNZ</u> senior management team <u>shallwill</u> ex-officio be members of each <u>Sub-</u>Committee.
- 12.4614.33 The Board shallwill prescribe the terms of reference and delegations for each Sub-Committee.
- 12.4714.34 The Board shallwill ensure that the actions of each Sub-Committee are consistent with the this Constitution, the Regulations, and strategic and other plans and the policies of YNZ.

## 43.15. CHIEF EXECUTIVE

- There shallwill be a Chief Executive of YNZ who shallwill be employed for such term and on such conditions as the Board may determine.
- The Chief Executive shallwill be under the direction of the Board and shallwill be responsible for the day-to-day management of the affairs of YNZ in accordance with this Constitution and the Rules, Regulations, by-laws, policies and procedures of YNZ and within such constraints as may be imposed by the Board.

13.315.3 The Chief Executive may attend Board meetings as and when required by the Board, but will have no voting rights.

# 16. **CONTACT PERSON**

16.1 The Board must appoint at least one, and a maximum of three, persons to be YNZ's Contact Person, subject to those persons meeting the eligibility criteria set out in the Act. The Board must advise the Registrar of Incorporated Societies of any change in the Contact Person or that person's Contact Details.

# <del>14.</del>17. **FINANCES**

- 14.117.1 Unless otherwise determined by the Board, the financial year of YNZ shallwill end on the 30th day of 30 June each year.
- The financial accounts shall statements will be prepared and shall be audited each year.

  The audited accounts shall financial statements must be submitted to the AGM. The auditors shall will be appointed at each AGM.
- 17.3 The financial statements of YNZ must be filed with the Registrar of Incorporated Societies within 6 months of the end of its financial year.
- All funds of YNZ shallwill be paid to a bank account in the name of YNZ and the bank account must be operated in accordance with the policy determined by the Board.
- The Board must ensure correct accounting records are kept. The accounting records of YNZ must be kept at the office of YNZ or at such place as the Board may determine and must be open to inspection by Members at such reasonable times as agreed by the Board.

### 45.18. COMMON SEAL

The common seal of YNZ shallwill be kept in the control of the Board and may be affixed to any document only by resolution of the Board and in the presence of and with the accompanying signatures of two Board Members.

## 46.19. REGULATIONS AND CODES OF CONDUCT

- 46.119.1 Regulations and Codes of Conduct for the better governance, conduct and control of the sport may be developed by a Committee, and shall thereafter and form part of the Regulations of YNZ, provided that:
  - (a) They are not inconsistent with the provisions of this Constitution;
  - (b) They are adopted by the Board;
- Such Rules, Regulations and Codes, of Conduct and any amendments thereto shall to them will be circulated promptly to all Member Glubs Members and reproduced published as appropriate on the YNZ website and in YNZ publications.

# 20. **DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

- 4.2 YNZ may consider, resolve, and/or decide disputes between and among any one or more Members acting in their capacity as Members, any one or more Officers acting in their capacity as Officers and YNZ, that relate to an allegation that:
- (a) a Member or an Officer has engaged in misconduct; or
- (b) a Member or an Officer has breached, or is likely to breach, a duty under this Constitution or the Act; or
- (c) YNZ has breached, or is likely to breach, a duty under this Constitution or the Act; or
- (d) a Member's rights or interests as a member have been damaged or Members' rights or interests generally have been damaged.
- 20.2 A Member or an Officer may make a complaint by giving written notice to the Board, or any subcommittee established for this purpose, that:
  - (a) states that the Member or Officer is starting a procedure for resolving a dispute under this Constitution;
  - (b) sets out the allegation to which the dispute relates and who the allegation is against; and
  - (c) sets out any other information reasonably required by YNZ.
- 20.3 YNZ may make a complaint involving an allegation against a Member or an Officer by giving

  Notice to the person concerned that:
  - (a) states that YNZ is starting a procedure for resolving a dispute under this Constitution; and
  - (b) sets out the allegation to which the dispute relates.
- 20.4 Unless YNZ decides not to proceed, the Member has a right to be heard before the complaint is resolved or any outcome is determined. A Member must be taken to have been given the right if:
  - (a) the Member has a reasonable opportunity to be heard in writing or at an oral hearing, if one is held; and
  - (b) an oral hearing is held if the decision maker considers that an oral hearing is needed to ensure an adequate hearing; and
  - (c) an oral hearing, if any, is held before the decision maker; and
  - (d) the Member's written statement or submissions, if any, are considered by the decision maker.
- 20.5 If YNZ makes a complaint, it has a right to be heard before the complaint is resolved or any outcome is determined and a Board Member may exercise that right on behalf of YNZ. YNZ must be taken to have been given the right if:
  - (a) they have a reasonable opportunity to be heard in writing or at an oral hearing, if one is held; and

- (b) an oral hearing is held if the decision maker considers that an oral hearing is needed to ensure an adequate hearing; and
- (c) an oral hearing, if any, is held before the decision maker; and
- (d) its written statement or submissions, if any, are considered by the decision maker.
- 20.6 The Member or Officer who, or YNZ which, is the subject of the complaint (**Respondent**) has a right to be heard before the complaint is resolved or any outcome is determined. If the Respondent is YNZ, a Board Member may exercise the right on behalf of YNZ.
- 20.7 A Respondent must be taken to have been given the right if:
  - (a) the Respondent is fairly advised of all allegations concerning the Respondent, with sufficient details and time given to enable the Respondent to prepare a response; and
  - (b) the Respondent has a reasonable opportunity to be heard in writing or at an oral hearing, if one is to be held; and
  - (c) an oral hearing is held if the decision maker considers that an oral hearing is needed to ensure an adequate hearing; and
  - (d) an oral hearing, if any, is held before the decision maker; and
  - (e) the Respondent's written statement or submissions, if any, are considered by the decision maker.
- 20.8 YNZ must as soon as is reasonably practicable after receiving a complaint or grievance, investigate and determine the complaint or grievance in a fair, efficient, and effective manner.
- 20.9 Despite the content of this clause and any other clause in this Constitution or in theRegulations, YNZ may decide not to proceed with a matter if:
  - (a) the complaint is trivial; or
  - (b) the complaint does not appear to disclose or involve any allegation of the following kind:
    - (i) any material misconduct; or
    - (ii) any material breach or likelihood of material breach of a duty under this Constitution or the Act: or
    - (iii) any material damage to a Member's rights or interests or Members' rights or interests generally; or
  - (c) the complaint appears to be without foundation or there is no apparent evidence to support it; or
  - (d) the person who makes the complaint has an insignificant interest in the matter; or
  - (e) the conduct, incident, event, or issue giving rise to the complaint has already been investigated and dealt with under this Constitution; or
  - (f) there has been an undue delay in making the complaint; or
  - (g) another process applies to the nature of the conduct, incident, event, or issue giving rise to the complaint.

### 20.10 YNZ may refer a complaint to:

- (a) a subcommittee or an external person to investigate and report; or
- (b) a subcommittee, an arbitral tribunal, or an external person to investigate and make a decision; or
- (c) with the consent of all parties to the complaint, to any type of consensual dispute resolution such as mediation or facilitation.
- 20.11 An individual may not act as a decision maker in relation to a complaint if two or more members of the decision-making body (whether it is the Board or a complaints subcommittee, tribunal, or other) consider that there are reasonable grounds to believe that the individual may not be:
  - (a) impartial; or
  - (b) able to consider the matter without a predetermined view.
- 20.12 The dispute resolution procedure set out above does not apply to the process set out in clauses 14.13 to 14.17 (Removal of Board Member) or to the processes set out in the Racing Rules of Sailing.

# 47.21. ALTERATIONS OF CONSTITUTION

- The Constitution may only be altered, added to or rescinded by a Special Resolution passed at a General Meeting.
- 47.221.2 No alteration, addition to or revision of thethis Constitution shallmay be approved if it affects the not-for-profit objects, purposes set out in clause 3, personal benefit prohibition in clause 22 or the winding-up rules liquidation or removal from the Register of Incorporated Societies of YNZ-under clause 23. This Rule 20.2 clause 21.2 must not be removed from this Constitution and must be included in any alteration of, addition to or revision of this Constitution.

#### 18.22. PROHIBITION ON PERSONAL BENEFIT

- 18.122.1 No Member—or, person associated with a Member or Board Member may participate in or materially influence any decisions by YNZ in respect of payment to or on behalf of that Member—or, associated person or Board Member of any income, benefit or advantage.
- 18.222.2 Any such income paid or benefit or advantage conferred Any payments made to a Member, person associated with a Member or Board Member must be for goods or services that advance the purposes of YNZ and must be reasonable and relative to that which would be received in an arm's length transaction (being the open market value). This provision and its effect must not be removed from these Rules and must be included in any alteration of, addition to or revision to these Rules.

#### 22.0 WINDING UP

YNZ-This clause 22 and its effect must be wound up not be removed from this Constitution and must be included in any alteration of, addition to or revision to this Constitution.

## 23. LIQUIDATION OR REMOVAL FROM REGISTER

- 48.323.1 A liquidator will not be appointed to YNZ and no Member may be authorised to request that YNZ is removed from the Register of Incorporated Societies except if YNZ, at a General Meeting of called in the manner provided in this Constitution, its Members, passes pass a Special Resolution requiring YNZ to be wound up and the resolution is confirmed by Special Resolution at a subsequent General Meeting called for that purpose and held not earlier than 60 days after the date on which the resolution to do so to be confirmed is passed.
- 18.423.2 If upon the winding-upliquidation or dissolution deregistration of YNZ there remains, after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever, the property shallmust not be paid to or distributed among the Members of YNZ unless permitted under the Act, but shallwill be given or transferred to some other organisation or bodynot-for-profit entity (as that term is defined in the Act) having objectspurposes similar to the objectspurposes of YNZ, or to some other charitable organisation or purpose withinnot-for-profit entity in New Zealand.

## <del>19.</del>24. **INDEMNITY**

19.124.1 YNZ shall indemnitymay indemnify, and/or with the prior approval of its Board effect insurance for, its Board Members, the Chief Executive and other efficersOfficers and employees of YNZ in respect of all liability arising from the proper performance as permitted by sections 94 to 98 of their functions connected with YNZthe Act.

# 20.25. SAVING PROVISION

23.1 If any matter should occur, which in the opinion of the Board is not provided for in thethis Constitution or the Regulations, such matter shallwill be determined by the Board. The Board may determine the matter in accordance either with the Rules and Regulations of YNZ or World Sailing or in such other manner as it may deem appropriate.
